# CITY OF PARIS ORDINANCE 2017-8

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING BY CONSENT TO THE CITY BOUNDARY, PROPERTY OF AUSTIN PAUL AND BRENDA PAUL, WHICH PROPERTY IS ADJACENT TO THE CITY, URBAN IN NATURE AND SUITABLE FOR DEVELOPMENT WITHOUT UNREASONABLE DELAY, AND IS GENERALLY SITUATED ON GEORGETOWN ROAD WEST OF THE CITY BOUNDARY, CONTAINING 28.700 ACRES, MORE OR LESS.

WHEREAS, Austin Paul and Brenda Paul, as owners of approximately 28.700 acres, more or less, of property lying on Georgetown Road and contiguous to the City limits of the City of Paris, have submitted a Consent to Annexation, pursuant to KRS 81A.412; and

WHEREAS, the City of Paris hereby declares that the unincorporated territory is subject to annexation pursuant to KRS 81A 410

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PARIS BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** That the City of Paris hereby annexes to the City boundary that certain tract of land west of the City, containing 28.700 acres, more or less, which property is owned by Austin Paul and Brenda Paul.

**Section 2.** That the property is adjacent and contiguous to the City, by reason of contiguous industrial property urban in nature, and suitable for development for urban purposes without unreasonable delay, and it is desirable for the City to annex such tract.

**Section 3.** That Austin Paul and Brenda Paul, as owners of record for the property to be annexed, according to the deed of record in the Office of the Bourbon County Court Clerk, consent to and have requested the City of Paris to annex their property, have formally requested that said property be annexed as evidenced by the attached "Consent to Annexation," identified as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

**Section 4.** That the tract to be annexed is more particularly described in the Exhibit included with the "Consent to Annexation" and identified as "Parcel 1" on Exhibit B, City of Paris Annexation Plat, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

**Section 5.** That following a public hearing and recommendation of the Bourbon County Joint Planning Commission, the initial zoning of said tract shall be as recommended, or as determined by the City pursuant to the provisions of KRS Chapter 100.

**Section 6.** This Ordinance shall become effective upon its passage, publication, and recording as required by law.
