Paris City Commission 525 High Street Paris, KY 40361 Meeting Minutes March 12, 2019

The Paris City Commission met in regular session in the City Commission Chambers at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, March 12, 2019.

Mayor, Johnny Plummer called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

City Clerk, Stephanie Settles conducted roll call.

**Present:** Mayor, Johnny Plummer; Commissioner, Matt Perraut; Commissioner, Wallis Brooks; Commissioner, Stan Galbraith; Commissioner, Anna Allen-Edwards.

Others in Attendance City Manager, Daron Jordan, Assistant City Manager, Mike Withrow, City Attorney, Bryan Beauman, and City Clerk/Treasurer, Stephanie Settles.

Upon determining a quorum was present for the transaction of business, City Manager, Daron Jordan proceeded to conduct the meeting.

#### Approve Minutes:

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Plummer, approving the minutes of February 26, 2019 regular meeting. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Allen-Edwards, Galbraith, Brooks, Perraut and Plummer voting Aye.

#### **Old Business**

Bryan Beauman discussed Omnibus Ordinance Revisions, suggesting reviewing on one title at a time. Daron Jordan stated he will send out Ordinances for review to the commission and to the specific department supervisors for review.

Daron Jordan discussed a draft listing of blighted, abandoned, and dilapidated properties siting 39 properties. Atlas St 505, 619; E 19th St 33, 43; Elizabeth St 318; Fields Ave 316; Higgins 613, 617; High St 427, 524; Houston Ave 281 (Under Renovation); Lilleston Ave 317, 333; Lylesville St 811, 859, 873; Main St 302; Marshall St 533; Maysville Ave 369; Mt Airy Ave 277; Patton St 508, 514; Scott Ave 248, 252; S Main 1539; Stearns Ave 316; Vine St 1054; W 5th St 9; W 7th St 425, 429; W 8th St 310, 411; Walker Ave 705, 820; Williams St 415, 419, 431, 615, 715.

- Commissioner, Allen-Edwards stated some of the homes have been without utilities since 1989, and some have been vacant for over 10 years, requesting a blighted and dilapidated code enforcement board for these types of properties.
  - Mike Withrow stated there is a current ordinance on file that addressees blighted property and a vacant property review commission board was created. The board met and reviewed the properties and deemed the properties were blighted and that is the boards authority level.
    - Bryan Beauman sited three options: 1) Remediate the property and file a lien against the property and the property stays in the current home owners name. 2) Move forward on lien and force the sale of the property. 3) Take title to property and remediate.

Commissioner, Allen-Edwards requested additional dollars to be allocated in the next budget for blighted, abandoned, and dilapidated properties.

Commissioner, Allen-Edwards discussed a concern received from a citizen; that the City of Paris has citizens serving on other boards and commissions representing The City of Paris that have houses on the dilapidated/condemned list. Allen-Edwards stated it gives a perception that we need to do better.

Daron Jordan stated he followed up with Ms. James in Lexington about their local opioid program, a meeting will be scheduled with her soon for further discussion on how to develop a program.

Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Allen-Edwards, Galbraith, Brooks, Perraut and Plummer voting Aye.
