Paris City Commission 525 High Street Paris, KY 40361 Meeting Minutes April 23, 2019

The Paris City Commission met in regular session in the City Commission Chambers at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, April 23, 2019.

Mayor, Johnny Plummer called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

City Clerk, Stephanie Settles conducted roll call.

Present: Mayor, Johnny Plummer; Commissioner, Matt Perraut; Commissioner, Wallis Brooks; Commissioner, Stan Galbraith; Commissioner, Anna Allen-Edwards.

Others in Attendance City Manager, Daron Jordan, Assistant City Manager, Mike Withrow, City Attorney, Bryan Beauman.

Upon determining a quorum was present for the transaction of business, City Manager, Daron Jordan proceeded to conduct the meeting.

Approve Minutes:

Motion by Plummer, seconded by Perraut, approving the minutes of April 9, 2019 regular meeting. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Allen-Edwards, Galbraith, Brooks, Perraut and Plummer voting Aye.

Kentucky State Representative, Matt Koch provided a legislative update. Koch stated almost 200 bills passed in the last session. Highlighting the passing of a school safety and resilience act SB 1, HB 354 helping local banks, Tax reform bill exempted nonprofit originations from collection of sales taxes on admissions, Fuel tax is in discussion with the expiration of toll credits on a federal level, HB358 passed related to quasi state government agencies.

Old Business

Daron Jordan stated he is waiting on costs and rules and regulations from the State concerning the signage to be installed recognizing the birthplace of Garrett Morgan.

Bryan Beauman stated conversations are being held with Charter Communications cable franchise about an extension of cable services in Paris and alerted Charter Communications is also aware of the new street cut ordinance.

Superintendent of the Water Plant, Chad Smart discussed water loss report for the third and fourth quarter. Chad stated the water meters need to be replaced within 10 years, after 10 years the meters will slow down and result in water loss.

- Daron Jordan stated it is difficult to calculate water loss because when a utility bill is read it is not the same day water usage is calculated and the readings are daily, and usage is calculated at month end resulting 10-20-day variance.
 - Commissioner, Allen-Edwards asked if the percentage of water loss has decreased with the replacement of water meters, stating it appears the water loss is substantial each month. With meters being replaced are we still seeing no change with the water loss percentage?
 - Mike Withrow stated with the meter replacements they are not seeing an improved water loss rate. Siting the average water loss for a municipality of 15% is good, a 25% loss is average. Mike stated he is meeting with a vendor next week about the potential of adding some master meters to monitor the flow of water and where it's going.

Motion by Allen-Edwards, seconded by Perraut, approving the purchase of a Vactor Combination Sewer Cleaning Machine from Jack Doheny contract # 122017-FSC for \$ 347,147.88 contingent that the City can obtain financing for that purchase. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Allen-Edwards, Galbraith, Brooks, Perraut and Plummer voting Aye.

Second Reading of an amendment to the Interlocal Agreement between The City of Paris and Bourbon County for the operation of the Joint Parks and Recreation Program was read by Bryan Beauman. The amendment sites the desire to amend by adding two additional members to the Parks and Recreation Board. The County Judge-Executive and the Fiscal Court will appoint 4 members. The Mayor and City Commission will appoint 4 members bringing the board to 9 members including 1 joint appointment.

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Perraut, approving the amended Interlocal Agreement between the City of Paris and Bourbon County Joint Parks and Recreation Program adding two additional members to the board one appointed by the Mayor of the City of Paris, and one appointed by the County Judge Executive. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Allen-Edwards, Galbraith, Brooks, Perraut and Plummer voting Aye.

New Business

Director of the Bluegrass Narcotics Task Force, Mark Burden discussed drug trends in Paris and surrounding areas and asking for continued financial report for supporting the drug taskforce. Ages 35-44 were the largest demographic in overdoses 52% of deaths were related to fentanyl and 22% was related to heroin overdoses. Requesting the City of Paris to continue to provide \$ 12,000 and one law enforcement officer to the taskforce. Burton stated five round ups and over 100 arrests have been made since March 2018 with this program.

Motion by Plummer, seconded by Allen-Edwards, approving the publishing of an RFP for six fiberglass composite transmission electric poles. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Allen-Edwards, Galbraith, Brooks, Perraut and Plummer voting Aye.

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Perraut, approving the purchase of a 2019 F350 4WD crew cab for the electric department from Paul Miller Ford at a state contract price of \$48,034.15. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Allen-Edwards, Galbraith, Brooks, Perraut and Plummer voting Aye.

Mayor Plummer discussed the Historic District overlay zone stating concerns have been received from Ron Carter over the demolition of historical buildings in Paris. Ron would like to expand the historic district area in Paris; and will be presenting a plan for review at the next meeting.

Motion by Plummer, seconded by Perraut, approving a Municipal Order appointing Marti Wornall to the Local Appeals Board. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Allen-Edwards, Galbraith, Brooks, Perraut and Plummer voting Aye.

A MUNICIPAL ORDER APPROVING THE MAYOR'S APPOINTMENT TO THE BOURBON COUNTY BOARD OF ASSESSMENT APPEALS.
