Paris City Commission 525 High Street Paris, KY 40361 Meeting Minutes November 26, 2019

The Paris City Commission met in regular session in the City Commission Chambers at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, November 26, 2019.

Mayor, Johnny Plummer called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

City Clerk, Stephanie Settles conducted roll call.

Present: Mayor, John A. Plummer; Commissioner, Matt Perraut; Commissioner, Wallis Brooks; Commissioner, Stan Galbraith; Commissioner, Anna Allen-Edwards.

Others in Attendance City Manager, Daron Jordan; Attorney, Bryan Beauman.

Upon determining a quorum was present for the transaction of business, City Manager, Daron Jordan, proceeded to conduct the meeting.

Approve Minutes

Motion by Galbraith, seconded by Brooks, approving the minutes of November 12, 2019 regular meeting. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Galbraith and Allen-Edwards voting Aye.

Public Comment

Andrea Brown introduced herself as the new Health Department Executive Public Health Director for Bourbon County. Andrea discussed the Health Departments new website that will show Restaurant food scores and also adding a prenatal program. Bourbon County was selected by UK to participate with phase 2 of a grant for opioid prevention program.

Old Business

Daron Jordan stated the committee has a meeting scheduled today with Perfection Group to discuss and review the finding of Energy efficiency for the City of Paris facilities.

Daron Jordan discussed 49 applications were received for the Chief of Police position. The resumes were reviewed by Human Resources Director Erin Morton and narrowed down to nine applicants. The nine applications were sent to the committee for review. Soft background checks have been completed on these applicants.

New Business

First reading of an Ordinance was read by Bryan Beauman relating to authorizing the issuance of two series of industrial revenue bonds having a combined aggregate principal amount of up to \$13,900,000 and designated the City of Paris, Kentucky, Industrial Building Revenue Bonds, Series 2019 (Hunt Advantage Group project) and the City of Paris, Kentucky, Industrial Building Revenue Bonds, Series 2019 (Seedtime and Harvest project), for the purpose of financing an industrial building project; approving and authorizing the execution and delivery of (a) a lease agreement between the City, as lessor, and Hunt Advantage Group, LLC, as lessee, (b) a lease agreement between the City, as lessor, and Seedtime and Harvest, LLC, as lessee, (c) separate bond purchase agreements providing for the issuance, sale, and delivery of each series of the bonds and providing for their negotiated sale, and (d) other related documents; and taking other related actions.

First reading of an ordinance was read by Bryan Beauman amending by consent to the city boundary, property of Paris-Bourbon County Economic Development Authority, Inc., which property is adjacent to the city, urban in nature and suitable for development without unreasonable delay and is generally situated on Cleveland Drive west of the city boundary, containing 19.499 acres, more or less.

Motion by Allen-Edwards, seconded by Galbraith, approving the 2020 Holiday closure schedule for the City of Paris offices. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Galbraith and Allen-Edwards voting Aye.
