Paris City Commission 525 High Street Paris, KY 40361 Meeting Minutes February 25, 2020

The Paris City Commission met in regular session in the City Commission Chambers at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, February 25, 2020.

Mayor, John Plummer called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

City Clerk, Stephanie Settles conducted roll call.

Present: Mayor, John A. Plummer; Commissioner, Matt Perraut; Commissioner, Wallis Brooks; Commissioner, Stan Galbraith; Commissioner, Anna Allen-Edwards.

Others in Attendance City Manager, Daron Jordan; Assistant City Manager, Mike Withrow; City Attorney, Bryan Beauman

Upon determining a quorum was present for the transaction of business, City Manager Daron Jordan, proceeded to conduct the meeting.

Approve Minutes

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Galbraith, approving the minutes of February 11, 2020 regular meeting. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Galbraith, and Allen-Edwards voting Aye.

Motion by Plummer, seconded by Brooks, approving the minutes of the special meeting of February 14, 2020. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Galbraith, and Allen-Edwards voting Aye.

Old Business

Board Development Academy meeting is scheduled for April 2, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. This will allow a training opportunity to citizens that may want to serve on boards that otherwise wouldn't have the opportunity to without this training.

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Perraut, awarding the water treatment plant clear well cleaning bid of \$59,659.00 to Suez. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Galbraith, and Allen-Edwards voting Aye.

Official notification has not been received from the Circuit Court approving the purchase of Atlas Street.

Preparations of the FY'21 budget has begun with the department supervisors.

Kentucky Transportation Cabinets Main and High Street project will start in the spring. 13th Street thru Downtown will be resurfacing. In 2021 the major road reconstruction will begin on High Street from the Courthouse to Hardees.

Commissioner Perraut continued discussions of lowering the age requirement for the Fire Department. The change will be included in the next policy and procedure manual update.

Motion by Galbraith, seconded by Brooks, approving the purchase of a Dodge Tradesman 2500 from Glenn's Freedom Dodge for \$ 32,619.00 for the Public Works Department. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Galbraith, and Allen-Edwards voting Aye.

New Business

First reading of an ordinance was read by Bryan Beauman. Relating to the City financial administration purchase procedure.

- The City Manager shall have the authority to make all purchases whose total cost exceeds five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) but is less than **fifteen ten** thousand dollars (\$15,000.00 10,000.00) provided that: (a) the City Manager follows the requirements of subsection (1) above and; (b) obtains the consent of the two members of the Board of Commissioners who comprise the Audit Committee.
- For any purchase whose total cost exceeds **fifteen** ten thousand dollars (\$15,000.00 10,000.00) but is less than **thirty** twenty thousand (\$30,000.00 20,000) dollars, the City Manager or his designee shall obtain two or more quotes from vendors, whenever practicable, and the Board of Commissioners shall select the quote most advantageous to the city. The city shall then follow the requirements of subsection (1).
- For any item to be purchased whose cost exceeds **thirty** thousand (\$30,000.00 \(\frac{20,000.00}{20,000.00} \)) dollars, the City shall follow the requirements of KRS 424.260, as it may be amended.

Motion by Perraut, seconded by Galbraith, approving the publishing of an RFP for Transfer Station Scales. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Galbraith, and Allen-Edwards voting Aye.

Motion by Perraut, seconded by Galbraith, approving the purchase of 4 sets of Globe fire gear from Fire Department Service and Supply for a total of \$ 14,588.00. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut Brooks, Galbraith, and Allen-Edwards voting Aye.

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Perraut, approving municipal order 2020-2 for the lease of premises in the City municipal building. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Galbraith, and Allen-Edwards voting Aye.
