Paris City Commission 525 High Street Paris, KY 40361 Meeting Minutes April 27, 2021

Pursuant to KRS 61.826 and OAG 20-05, the state of emergency regarding the threats to public health presented by the novel corona virus (covid-19) pandemic and municipal order. This meeting of the Paris city commission was conducted by video conference. All city commission meetings may be attended by the public by viewing the video conference at the city's Facebook page online.

The Paris City Commission met in regular session at 9:00 a.m. viewable on Facebook live at <a href="www.facebook.com/cityofparisky">www.facebook.com/cityofparisky</a> on Tuesday, April 27, 2021.

Mayor, John Plummer called the meeting to order, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

City Manager, Daron Jordan, conducted roll call.

Present: Mayor, John Plummer; Commissioner, Wallis Brooks; Commissioner, Holli Gibson; Commissioner, Stan Galbraith; Commissioner, Angela Roberts

Others in Attendance: City Manager, Daron Jordan; Assistant City Manager, Mike Withrow; Finance Director, Brad Oberlander; City Attorney, Todd Osterloh, and City Clerk, Stephanie Settles.

Upon determining a quorum was present for the transaction of business, Mayor Plummer proceeded to conduct the meeting.

### **Approval of Minutes**

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Roberts, approving the minutes of regular meeting on April 13, 2021. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Gibson, Brooks, Galbraith, and Roberts voting Aye.

Motion by Plummer, seconded by Roberts, approving the minutes of special meeting on April 20, 2021. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Gibson, Brooks, Galbraith, and Roberts voting Aye.

### **Old Business / Action Items**

Motion by Plummer, seconded by Brooks, awarding Hinkle Contracting the asphalt paving bid of \$52,867.50 for Fire Station 2 driveway and parking areas. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Gibson, Brooks, Galbraith, and Roberts voting Aye.

Motion by Gibson, seconded by Plummer, approving municipal order 2021-8 authorizing a cost sharing by the city with property owners for the repair, installation, placement, removal, and replacement of sidewalks. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Gibson, Brooks, Galbraith, and Roberts voting Aye.

### CITY OF PARIS ORDER 2021-8

A MUNICIPAL ORDER AUTHORIZING COST SHARING BY THE CITY WITH PROPERTY OWNERS FOR THE REPAIR, INSTALLATION, PLACEMENT, REMOVAL AND REPLACEMENT OF SIDEWALKS

WHEREAS, some sidewalks within the City are in a state of disrepair, are missing or do not connect at various locations, and as a result are unsightly, affect the aesthetic value of the surrounding properties, impair the convenience of pedestrian traffic, and potentially pose a safety concern for City citizens and visitors; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to address and alleviate these concerns and to provide an opportunity to assist property owners in repairing, installing, removing and replacing sidewalks that are determined by sharing in the cost required in accomplishing these improvements;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED AND RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Paris as follows:

- 1. It is the desire and intent of the City Commission to establish a list of sidewalks that need repair, installation, or removal and replacement.
- 2. This list shall include the street address and name of the abutting property owner. Sidewalk repairs, installation, removal, and replacement as identified in the list shall be bid out by the City and a schedule to complete the work developed.
- 3. Certain properties are ineligible to be included on the list of qualifying sidewalks including any real property is considered to be an abandoned or blighted property list or which property has been referred by the Bourbon County Planning Office for determination or resolution of violations of building or maintenance codes, ordinances, rules or regulations, or for which there are outstanding and unpaid *ad valorem* taxes or other taxes unpaid and owed to the City until the owner satisfies and cures any outstanding issues.
- 4. Upon establishing a list of eligible sidewalks for participation in this program, the City will provide written notice to each abutting property owner of their right to participate in a cost sharing program established by the City for the repair, placement, removal, and replacement of sidewalks identified.
- 5. Upon notifying property owners of their right to participate in the sidewalk cost sharing program and the respective cost involved; property owners shall have until June 15, 2021 in which to give signed written notice delivered to the City Clerk/Treasurer of the property owner(s) intention to participate in the sidewalk cost sharing program.
- 6. Before any repair, removal and replacement of a sidewalk is made pursuant to this cost sharing program with abutting property owners, the owner shall be required to pay to the City the owner's share of the total cost of the project associated with the owner's property.
- 7. The City will pay up to fifty (50%) percent of the cost for the repair, removal and replacement of sidewalks that are designated on the list established by the City but limited to a dollar amount not to exceed a maximum contribution amount of \$2,500.00, subject to the abutting property owner paying to the City the remaining amount of the total cost to be performed at the owner's real property location.
- 8. This sidewalk cost sharing program is limited to a maximum amount of money contributed by the City of \$25,000.00. Once the City's maximum contribution limit has been reached, any further notices from property owners will be placed on a wait list. Therefore, time is of the essence regarding a property owner's participation in this cost sharing program by providing notice of the owner's intention to participate and to pay in advance for their share of the costs.
- 9. For any property owner who is denied City funds or who decides against or objects to participating in the cost sharing program by declining to give signed written notice of their intention to participate and to pay the owner's respective share of the sidewalk repair, removal and replacement costs within the timeframe set forth above, the property owner shall nonetheless be subject to the provisions of any City Ordinance including the responsibility for making the needed repairs, placement, removal or replacement at the abutting owner's cost without benefit of the City sharing in

the cost, and the City is not in any way restricted from repairing, removing and replacing sidewalks and asserting liens against the property where sidewalks have been repaired, removed and replaced by the City.

- 10. This Order authorizing a sidewalk cost sharing program is applicable only for the calendar year 2021 and an owner's opportunity to participate will terminate once the City has awarded a bid to a contractor if notice of intention to participate is not given the City by that date.
- 11. By authorizing and approving this Sidewalk Cost Sharing Program, the City does not commit to or intend to establish any precedent to offer this program in the future nor does this Order reduce, negate, or eliminate an owner's responsibility of a property to comply with applicable ordinances requiring property owners to repair, remove and replace sidewalks abutting their property. Eligibility for any future Sidewalk Cost Sharing Program will be based on requirements as established for any cost sharing program that may be offered at that particular time.

Motion by Gibson, seconded by Roberts, approving to re-publish an RFP for a truck for the Wastewater and Wastewater Collections Department because the first RFP had no responses. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Gibson, Brooks, Galbraith, and Roberts voting Aye.

Motion by Gibson, seconded by Plummer, to approve a single contribution of \$22,500.00 to be paid to the Paris-Bourbon County Chamber of Commerce to help fund the first year of professional services provided to the Chamber by Retail Strategies, consistent with its Retail Development Services Proposal. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Gibson, Brooks, Galbraith, and Roberts voting Aye.

### **Old Business / Action Items**

Motion by Galbraith, seconded by Roberts, approving the purchase of a police K-9 for \$ 27,900.00 and an additional \$ 1,900.00 to cover the remainder of the initial purchase necessities for the K-9. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Gibson, Brooks, Galbraith, and Roberts voting Aye.

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Roberts, reappointing Melissa Happy to the Joint Parks and Recreation Board for a four-year term to expire March 21, 2025. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Gibson, Brooks, Galbraith, and Roberts voting Aye.

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Galbraith, approving Lewis Stubblefield to the Bourbon County Joint Planning & Zoning Commission for a term ending December 31, 2024. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Gibson, Brooks, Galbraith, and Roberts voting Aye.

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Galbraith, approving Emmett Davis to the Paris Housing Authority Board for a four-year term ending August 31, 2025. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Gibson, Brooks, Galbraith, and Roberts voting Aye.

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Roberts, approving Amy Spanuolo to the Ethics Board for a Four-year term ending January 31, 2025. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Gibson, Brooks, Galbraith, and Roberts voting Aye.

Andrea Lacy with the Joint Paris-Bourbon County Planning and Zoning provided the commission with a comprehensive plan update for review. No action was taken.

#### Financials

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Roberts, approving March financials as presented by Brad Oberlander, reflecting General Fund Revenues of \$ 6,581,524 with expenditures of \$ 5,630,641.00. Utility Fund Revenues of \$ 7,566,902.00 with expenditures of \$ 7,055,992.00. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Brooks, Roberts, Galbraith, Gibson voting Aye.

Motion by Galbraith, seconded by Roberts, approving payment of invoices as presented. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Brooks, Gibson, Galbraith, and Roberts voting Aye.
