Mayor, Michel Thornton called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

City Clerk, Stephanie Settles conducted roll call.

Upon determining a quorum was present for the transaction of business, City Manager, Daron Jordan proceeded to conduct the meeting.

**CITY OF PARIS
ORDINANCE NO. 2018-15**

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO EXCAVATIONS OF AND CONSTRUCTION TO PUBLIC RIGHTS-OF-WAY

WHEREAS, the City of Paris has endured numerous excavations to City streets and is in need of a uniform system to permit, maintain and repair such work to the public rights of way;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PARIS CITY COMMISSION THAT THE FOLLOWING SECTIONS OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES BE ADDED:

Section 1. Permit for Work Within The Right-Of-Way.

(A) Except during an emergency, individuals or entities shall not disturb, modify, engage in construction activities or change the primary or regulated use of, the roads, streets, rights-of-way, easements or property belonging to or maintained by the City without first applying for and receiving a permit to engage in such activities from the City Manager, which permit shall be signed by the City Manager or designee.

(B) The applicant or permittee shall have the right to appeal the decision of the City Manager to deny or revoke a permit application. The appeal must be made to the Board of Commissioners within 10 business days from issuance of notice of denial or revocation by delivery to the City Clerk. An appeal does not stay the denial or revocation of the permit. A hearing shall be held by the Board of Commissioners within a reasonable time.

(C) The City Manager or designee shall promulgate and publish a Right-of-Way Standard that specifies rules, regulations, guidelines and procedures related to the permitting of any work, construction, installation, maintenance, closure, temporary use, disturbance, modification or change of the primary usage within the roads, streets or rights-of-way belonging to or maintained by the City. The Right-of-Way Standard shall be provided to the City Clerk and all providers of utility services, whether public, private or municipal entities.

(D) At the time of application, the necessary permit fee must be paid as follows:

Section 2. Restoration of Excavated Street.

(A) On any project that damages city owned or maintained pavement the permittee will follow the established standards in repairing the damage and the city will coordinate, perform or have performed the final pavement repairs. Permit applicants that may damage or excavate pavement shall pay a fee to the city that will be equal to the pavement repair estimate plus 15%. The City Manager or their designee shall prepare the estimate which will be based upon the proposed scope of work, category of road and either the City's competitively bid pavement repair contract or prevailing rates for such work. Exceptions to this rule must be approved by the City Manager as outlined in the Right-of-Way Standard.

(B) The City will require bonding of all excavation, trenching, boring or other construction work performed on or under the pavement surface as detailed in the Right-of-Way Standard. The City reserves the right to require bonding on other work that damages or has the potential to damage City property. The lack of bonding or an expired bond does not release the permittee or contractor from any liability related to work in the right-of-way or on City owned or maintained property. The Permittee will be

the responsible party for all bonding, not the Permittee's subcontractor.

The foregoing ordinance shall take effect immediately upon execution and publication.

**CITY OF PARIS
ORDINANCE NO. 18-16**

AN ORDINANCE AWARDED A FIVE-YEAR GAS DISTRIBUTION FRANCHISE TO COLUMBIA GAS OF KENTUCKY FOR THE OPERATION OF A NATURAL AND ARTIFICIAL GAS PIPELINE WITHIN THE CONFINES OF THE CITY OF PARIS, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Paris previously adopted Order No. 2018-1 of February 13, 2018 which authorized the advertisement for bids to award a franchise to acquire, lay, maintain and operate in, above, under, across and along the streets, thoroughfares, alleys, avenues, roads, highways, sidewalks, bridges, public ways and other public places of the City of Paris, Kentucky, a system of mains, pipes and connections, with all the necessary or desirable appurtenances, for the purpose of transporting, distributing and vending natural and artificial gas to the City, and persons and corporations beyond the limits thereof, and any other purpose or purposes for which natural and artificial gas is now or may in the future be used, and for the distribution of same within, through or across the City; and

WHEREAS, Columbia Gas of Kentucky has been granted a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity by the Commonwealth of Kentucky Public Service Commission dated March 27, 2018 that authorizes Columbia Gas of Kentucky to bid on a franchise for gas distribution services offered by the City of Paris; and

WHEREAS, Columbia Gas of Kentucky was the sole bidder of the gas distribution franchise but did not agree in full to the terms of the request for bids but offered alternative terms; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to reach agreement with alternative terminology and award this franchise, and has contemporaneously adopted an Ordinance to address street excavation, Ordinance No. 2018-15, to address certain terms of the bid for the award of a natural gas franchise.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PARIS CITY COMMISSION AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Columbia Gas of Kentucky, Inc., be and is hereby awarded a five year gas distribution franchise for operation of a gas distribution system within the confines of the City of Paris based upon and subject to the terms, specifications, restrictions and obligations as set forth in the attached Franchise Agreement.

Section 2. The Mayor of the City of Paris is hereby authorized and directed to execute any necessary documents to memorialize this Ordinance, and City staff is authorized to perform any and all acts pursuant to the implementation of the gas distribution franchise.

Section 3. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such infirmity shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the Ordinance.

Section 4. That this Ordinance shall take effect on January 1, 2019.

The foregoing ordinance was introduced and read for the first time as the City Commission's regular meeting of November 27, 2018. Read for the second time, adopted and approved at its regular meeting of December 11, 2018.

3. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute the City Manager Employment Agreement and any other necessary documents as may be required.
4. This Municipal Order shall take effect immediately upon execution.
