Meeting Minutes  
May 6, 2022

The Paris City Commission met in special session at 9:00 a.m. on Friday May 6, 2022.

Mayor Plummer called the meeting to order.

Mayor Plummer conducted roll call.

Present: Mayor Plummer Commissioner, Wallis Brooks; Commissioner, Stan Galbraith; Commissioner, Angela Roberts, Commissioner Holli Gibson.

Others in Attendance: City Attorney, Bryan Beauman; Financial Director, Brad Oberlander

Absent: None

Upon determining a quorum was present for the transaction of business, Mayor Plummer proceeded to conduct the meeting.

Motion by Galbraith, seconded by Brooks, to accept the recommendation of the Convenience Recycling /Transfer station committee to accept Kenvirons, Inc as the architect and civil engineering firm for the planning and design services of the Waste and Recycling convenience center. Motion carried by vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Brooks, Galbraith, Gibson, and Roberts voting Aye.

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Plummer, approving to set a public hearing for the use of municipal road aid funds on May 10, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. at City Hall 525 High Street Paris, Ky 40361. Motion carried by vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Brooks, Galbraith, Gibson, and Roberts voting Aye.

First reading of an ordinance amending the zoning map for property owned by William Herrington, jr. and Teresa Herrington, located at 2005 & 2007 south main street, from general commercial (b-2) and residential (r-3) (i-1) to residential (r-5), or purposes of constructing a multiple family dwelling, consisting of 0.7 acres, more or less, as the proposed zoning is in direct alignment with the 2017 comprehensive plan future land use map, and pursuant to the recommendation of the joint planning commission after a public hearing.

First reading of an ordinance an ordinance amending the zoning map for property owned by William Perry Letton, located at 1021 bypass road, from residential (r-1) to general commercial (b-2) for 5.6 acres, more less, residential (r-5) for 22 acres, more or less, and to residential (r-8) for 22 acres, more or less, for purposes of residential and commercial development, consisting of a total of 50.6 acres, more or less, as it is in direct alignment with the 2017 comprehensive plan future land use map and also in alignment with the adopted goals and objectives of the comprehensive plan, and pursuant to the recommendation of the joint planning commission after a public hearing.

Commissioner inquired on the sick time pay out request from a former employee. Bryan Beauman stated that is included on the agenda for Tuesday and he will be sending a memo to the commission.

Commissioner Gibson inquired on the status of the amazon account who is on the account and if it has been changed to a business account. Erin Morton stated there are no longer any personal connections with the city account and her amazon account, she no longer has anything to do with the city account Linda is now doing all the purchasing, Stephanie has access and working on giving Sheli access to the account. Erin stated that the account changed on April 6<sup>th</sup>, 2022, to a line of credit and purchases will be billed. The city visa is no longer linked on the account, Erin stated she has a meeting scheduled at 11:30 a.m. on Monday with amazon to discuss and update the terms. Commissioner Roberts stated since Erin is no longer on the account that amazon should meet with Linda. Commissioner Brooks stated that the Mayor or Brad should be able to view all purchases on the account.
